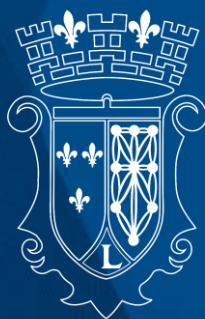

# **GOLF DE SAINT GERMAIN**

## **BRIEF HISTORY**

### **The early years**

The origins began with Mr de la Lombardière, one of the few French people who played golf at that time. He and his friend, Georges Durand, formed a partnership with Louis Trouvet to create the Ermitage Golf Club, at Port Marly.

The club had only nine holes. The farm, which was used as the clubhouse, was in a flood risk area. By 1920 the number of members had grown to about 150, for which the existing facility was too small, so 52 hectares were bought in Saint-Germain and thus Saint-Germain Golf Club, as we know it today, was born.

In December 1920, Georges Durand brought in Harry Colt to oversee the design and construction of the course.

Colt's ambition was to create a course of differing holes in the middle of the forest. He created an artificial landscape with mounds for bunkers and a few elevated greens.

He favoured strategy over punishment and made sure that it was a test for a good player while giving encouragement to less talented players.

In 1921, the clubhouse at Marly was dismantled, transported to Saint Germain, and reconstructed.

The official opening took place on 15 January 1922. Harry Colt's original design was shorter and quite different from the course that is played today.

A few years later the Club was able to purchase an additional 20 hectares and Harry Colt was reappointed to re-design the course and also create a 9-hole course called the Parcours de Genêts. This is the basis of the club today.

### **The modern era**

Since its creation the course has been consistently upgraded with new machinery and technology making significant improvements. Over the last few decades, a garage and repair room, a caddie lodge have been built, and a golf school have been created.

In 2002 a new short game practice area was created, including two greens and four bunkers for putting and chipping.

Saint-Germain has recently made it into the top 20 of Golf World's top 100 courses in Continental Europe and is talked about by many in the know as a real hidden gem.

The club has hosted the French Open nine times and the last winner here was Seve Ballesteros in 1985, when he shot a course record 62 (tied by a member Thomas Perrot in 2019).

The first World Amateur Team Championship for women was held over the course in 1964, when the French Team lifted the prestigious Espirito Santo Trophy.

Regularly, the Club has organized many amateur and professional tournaments such as the Hennessy Cup, the Ford Trophy, the European Ladies' Team Championship, and numerous French championships.

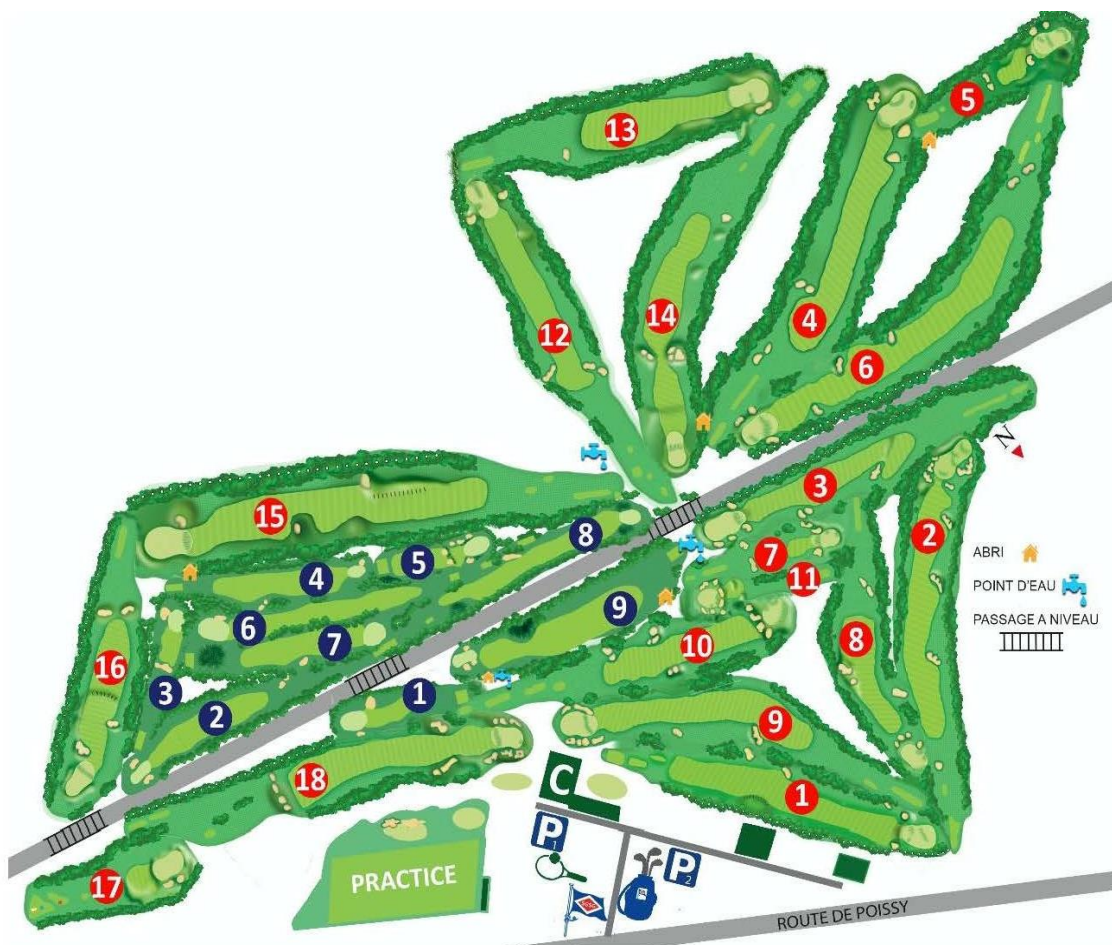

Closing date for entries: Wednesday 8 June 2022, no later than 5pm CET.

## REGISTRATION

Registration opens at 8am on Monday 18 July and closes at 12pm (noon) on Tuesday 19 July. All competitors must register immediately on arrival at the Golf de Saint-Germain. Failure to register in time may result in the competitors losing their place in the starting field.

## PRACTICE FACILITIES

The driving range will be in operation and complimentary practice balls will be provided. The Driving Range will close at 6.30pm each day.

30 spots are available, among them, 15 are on a grass area.

3 putting greens and a short game area will also be made available to competitors.

Please note that it will not be possible to have dinner at the golf's restaurant.

## **CHANGING ROOM**

A changing room will be available where showers and towels will also be made available for participants.

## **THE OPENING CEREMONY**

Players and guest are welcome to the Opening Ceremony, held on Tuesday 19 July, 5 pm, at the golf club.

## **DRESS CODE**

A reasonable standard of dress/ attire is expected at all times, both on the course and in the Clubhouse. Jeans, sleeveless or collarless shirts and tracksuits are not permitted.

**Caps and hats are not permitted in the Clubhouse.**

Making or taking phone calls is not permitted in the Clubhouse and may only be done outside and in case of emergencies.

## **MEDICAL CERTIFICATE**

In accordance with the French law, a medical certificate, is required from all participants.

Failure to do so will result in the removal of the player's entry for the championship.

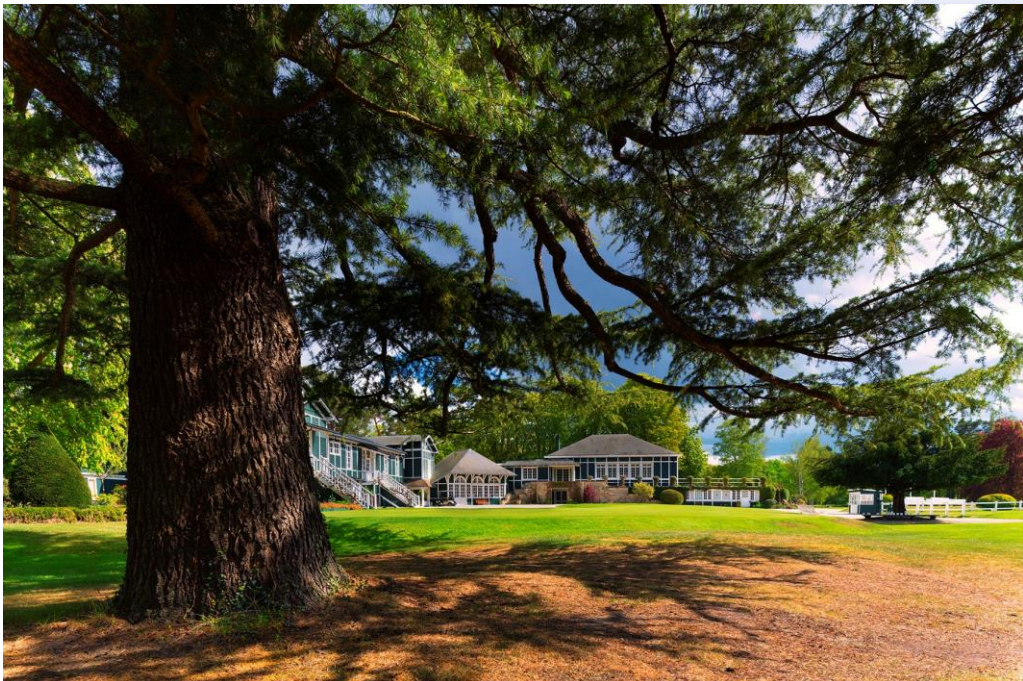
