

SCOTTISH MEN'S OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP TERMS OF THE COMPETITION

The following must be read in conjunction with the Scottish Golf General Terms of the Competition.

Handicap Limit: 0.4
Entry Fee: £85
Field Size: 144
Closing Date: Monday 1 May 2023 @ 12 Noon

1. Eligibility

To be eligible entrants must be:

- a) Male and of amateur status as defined by R&A Rules Limited.
- b) In possession of a WHS Handicap Index not exceeding 0.4.

2. Exemptions from Pre-Qualifying

The following entrants will be exempt from Pre-Qualifying:

- a) The 55 highest ranked entrants in the World Amateur Golf Rankings at close of entry.
- b) The next 55 entrants with the lowest WHS Handicap Index at close of entry.
- c) Up to a maximum of 6 players, already entered, as nominated by Scottish Golf.

3. Pre-Qualifying

- a) Any entrant not exempt under categories 2. a – c at close of entry will automatically be entered into pre-qualifying at Kemnay Golf Club on Tuesday 30 May 2023. *Any entrant not intending to pre-qualify (if not exempt from pre-qualifying at close of entries), must specify this at time of entry. Failure to notify Scottish Golf will result in entrants being included in the pre-qualifying draw and entry fees will not be refunded.
- b) The maximum field size for pre-qualifying is 144. If numbers exceed 144, entrants will be balloted on lowest WHS Handicap Index at close of entries and placed on a waiting list.
- c) A minimum of 28 qualifying places (and all reserve places) for the Scottish Men's Open Championship will be available through pre-qualifying. Should any exempt player withdraw after the closing date their place will be added to pre-qualifying.
- d) The format of pre-qualifying shall comprise of a scheduled 18-holes of stroke play contested over one day.
- e) Qualifying places will be decided and allocated in lowest gross score order.
- f) In the event of a tie for qualifying or reserve place(s) a card count back will resolve any ties. The count back will be based on the lowest gross score of the last 9-holes (or 6, 3 or 1). If a tie still arises, the last 6, 3 or 1-hole(s) of the first 9-holes. If no decision is reached, a card play-off from hole 1 will apply, failing which; any remaining ties will be decided by lot.
- g) In the event of no play being possible on the pre-qualifying day, places in the Scottish Men's Open Championship will be determined by the lowest WHS Handicap Index at close of entry. Should there be a tie for the final places these shall be decided by lot.
- h) In the event of total championship entries failing to exceed 144 or following withdrawals, the number of places in the final field equalling or exceeding pre-qualifying numbers, all players would automatically gain entry to the Scottish Men's Open Championship and pre-qualifying would not take place.
- i) Caddies are permitted.

4. Scottish Men's Open Championship

- a) The championship shall comprise of a scheduled 72-holes of stroke play contested over 3 days. The top 40 competitors and ties returning the lowest gross scores after 36-holes will qualify for the final 36-holes.
- b) The championship winner will be the competitor returning the lowest 72-holes gross score.
- c) In the event of a tie for first place after 72-holes, the championship shall be decided by a sudden death play-off over holes to be decided by Scottish Golf. In the event of a tie for 2nd or subsequent places, a card count back will resolve any ties. The count back will be based on the lowest final 18-holes gross score and if still tied the gross score of the last 9-holes (or 6, 3 or 1). If a tie still arises, the last 6, 3 or 1-hole(s) of the first 9-holes. If no decision is reached, a card play-off from hole 1 will apply, failing which; the winner will be decided by lot.

d) Caddies are permitted.

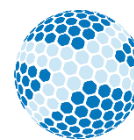
5. Winner and Prizes

The winner of the championship will be the Scottish Men's Open Champion.

A prize presentation will follow the conclusion of play.

Winner:	Championship Trophy & Crystal Award
Runner-Up:	Runner-Up Crystal Award
Third Place:	3 rd Place Crystal Award

All trophies awarded at championships shall be retained by Scottish Golf. Any player not present at the prize presentation who has failed to notify Scottish Golf will not be presented with their prize.



General Terms of the Competition

1. Rules of Golf

All championships shall be played in accordance with the R&A Rules of Golf and in addition to the Scottish Golf Limited (Scottish Golf) Hard Card and the championship specific Terms of the Competition.

All championships will be run by Scottish Golf to whom all disputes will be referred and whose decision will be final.

2. Amateur Status

All players must be of amateur status as defined by R&A Rules Limited.

3. Entries & Fees

- a) All entries must be completed and received by Scottish Golf by 12 noon on the closing date. They must be accompanied by payment.
- b) Entry can be made via the Scottish Golf [Website](#) and payment will be taken at time of entry.
- c) It is the entrant's responsibility to check that their entry has been received by the closing date.
- d) Scottish Golf will only consider late entries should the maximum field size not be achieved and thereafter at their discretion up to 48 hours prior to the championship concerned.
- e) In the event of a championship being over-subscribed, the level of entries will be reduced to maximum field size number in order of WHS Handicap Index at close of entry unless otherwise outlined in the terms of the competition.
- f) An entry fee will only be refunded if the entrant confirms their withdrawal prior to the closing date by email to events@scottishgolf.org, or, if they fail to gain entry to the championship.
- g) Refunds will be issued where applicable within 28 days of the final day of the event concerned.
- h) Competitors must walk at all times during a stipulated round, unless authorised by a member of the Committee, or permission to use a buggy has been granted in accordance with the Scottish Golf Transportation Policy.
- i) All entries are subject to the approval of Scottish Golf who reserve the right to refuse or accept or, having accepted, subsequently reject any entry. Scottish Golf will not accept entries from Russia or Belarus.
- j) Correspondence will be sent electronically where an email address has been provided. All information will also be available to view on the Scottish Golf [Website](#). Scottish Golf will not be responsible for any correspondence that fails to reach the individual.

4. Handicaps

- a) All entrants must be in a possession of a WHS Handicap Index.
- b) The WHS Handicap Index certified at close of entry will be used for all purposes.
- c) It is the entrants' responsibility to ensure that their WHS Handicap Index is up-to-date at all times. Scottish Golf will take no responsibility for any out-of-date WHS Handicap Index used for balloting or any other purpose.
- d) Independent golfers will only be eligible to enter multi-day National Championships when they hold a mature handicap record of 20+ scores with a minimum of 5 of the last 10 being competition scores. A record comprising of only General Play scores will not be acceptable for entry purposes.

5. Reserves

- a) Entrants who fail to gain entry will be allocated a place on a reserve list in order of WHS Handicap Index at close of entry unless otherwise outlined in the terms of the competition.
- b) A reserve list will be maintained and managed by Scottish Golf. Should a place(s) in the starting field become available, reserves will be invited to play in the order they are listed on the reserve list. Reserves 1-3 will be permitted to play an official practice round (s).
- c) Should a reserve be unable to be reached, Scottish Golf event staff reserve the right to contact the next available reserve on the list to obtain a full starting field.

6. Withdrawals

- a) In the event of a competitor withdrawing after the closing date, the entry fee will not be refunded.

- b) Withdrawals will only be accepted if written confirmation is received in to events@scottishgolf.org from the player.
- c) If a competitor withdraws from the match play stages of an event after the match play draw is published, their opponent will be the winner of the match.
- d) Any competitor who:
 - Fails to notify Scottish Golf of their withdrawal within 48 hours prior to the start of the championship.
 - Withdraws from a championship after the draw has been published.
 - Fails to appear on the tee at their appointed start time.
 - Having commenced a round, fails to continue for a reason (or displays behaviour) Scottish Golf deems unacceptable.

May be subject to an automatic ban (or other disciplinary action) from playing in or entering any Scottish Golf Championships for such a period as Scottish Golf deem appropriate.

Any player who no returns/withdraws/retires during a championship will not be permitted to take any further part.

7. Registration

- a) Competitors must register their intention to compete in a championship by 15:00 on the official practice day(s), either in person at the Championship Office or by other designated method notified to the competitor.
- b) Failure to do so may result in the competitor forfeiting their place.

8. Inclement Weather or Exceptional Circumstances

If, in the opinion of Scottish Golf, it becomes impossible to complete a championship in accordance with that championship's Terms of the Competition, because of adverse weather or other circumstances, Scottish Golf reserves the right to amend the championship format to the extent necessary to achieve a result within the time available.

9. Trophies / Prizes

All trophies awarded at championships shall be retained by Scottish Golf.

Any player not present at the prize presentation who has failed to notify Scottish Golf will not be presented with their prize.

- e) Anti-Doping Rules – The UK Anti-Doping Rules apply to all persons licensed (whether permanently, provisionally, temporarily, or otherwise) to participate in golf, for whichever is the longer of a) the length of the licence period; or b) 12 months from the start date of the competition, in accordance with the Scottish Golf Terms of Competition. [whether or not the licence holder is a citizen of, or resident in, the UK]. An individual who wishes to unbind themselves from the license can do so by formally notifying Scottish Golf of their retirement from competition by emailing performance@scottishgolf.org. - f) Images/Video & Publications – Scottish Golf arranges publicity before and during the championship in the press and by live and recorded radio and television broadcasting and filming and on the internet on the following sites
